Inside The Numbers

Vargas came out with urgency befitting a defending champion, out-landing Rodriguez 15-11 in the first frame and setting a tone that suggested the underdog billing might be misplaced. But the fight's central tension revealed itself almost immediately: Vargas going punch for punch with Rodriguez was a transaction that favored only one man.

When Rodriguez turned up the volume in the second round — landing 21 power punches to Vargas's 17 — the pattern clarified. Vargas answered in the third, landing 20 to Rodriguez's 9, but every exchange carried a hidden tax. The openings Vargas created by staying in exchanges were openings Rodriguez could exploit, and his overhand left had the kind of authority that made those openings costly.

The fifth round delivered the bill. A Rodriguez left dropped Vargas, who survived on instinct. Showing the heart that comes with a title reign, Vargas came out trying to mount something in the sixth — and ran into another left that ended the night at 1:15.

The final efficiency numbers explain the outcome cleanly. Both men landed 81 power punches, but Rodriguez needed only 213 attempts to get there while Vargas required 279 — a 38% clip against 29%. Vargas threw 66 more punches to produce the same landed total, and in a fight against a man who punishes over-extension, that inefficiency was ultimately fatal.

Rodriguez is a three-division champion at 26. The ceiling remains very much open.
